**For our summer internship positions, we typically look for undergraduate- or master's-level candidates with:**

- **Significant coursework in applied economics**
- **At least one course in statistics, ideally covering multivariate analysis techniques**
- **Strong writing and communication skills**
- **An interest in promoting objective analysis of public policy**

The typical application package includes resume, cover letter, transcript (unofficial is fine), and one writing sample that demonstrates the candidate's ability to write and think clearly and analytically.
